A FAMILY-CENTERED House of God

Building Up the House of God is a continual process, one that the Metropolis is devoted to, and one that our parishes strive to achieve on an ongoing basis. His Eminence Metropolitan Gerasimos has initiated a five-year program that focuses on building up our communities, with a specific theme each year. The first year will be dedicated to developing ministries for the Family. In year two, the theme will be Worship. The third year will focus on Fellowship.

strengthening the fellowship within our communities is vital to this cause, parish life begins with the gathering of the people, those who have been called out by God and have joined the Body of Christ.

His Eminence Metropolitan Gerasimos states, "The family is at the core of our church, as we are all one family in Christ. We need to work together as a family, showing love, respect and support to those around us, and join together in prayer as a source of strength and inspiration. Our society has placed

great challenges on the stability of the family, but as a Church, we are obligated to combat the social pressures and emphasize the importance of sustaining the family as a whole, as well as providing for the

As part of the Metropolis Family Wellness Ministry, some parishes are offering monthly family night activities; others provide child care so parents can enjoy an evening out; some facilitate support groups for grief and bereavement, weight loss, and addiction, while others provide

special classes to help families in their personal financial struggles during this economic downturn. The Metropolis has also offered

A WORSHIPPING House of God

Worship is integral to our lives as Orthodox Christians, and our parishes anchor their ministries in the worship life of the Church, beyond Sunday liturgies to weekday





feasts, Paraklesis, Vespers, and more, witnessing to what the Church is foremost – a worshipping House of God. Beyond worshipping together, many parishes maintain prayer lists of those who are sick or otherwise in

need, and our parishioners openly seek the counsel of our clergy during times of personal struggle.

Orthodox worship is musical worship, and the parishes in our Metropolis offer hymns of praise to God in a variety of ways. While some parishes have large polyphonic

choirs, others have congregational singing, Byzantine Chant, and active children's choirs, making our rich musical tradition accessible in a variety of ways. All of these efforts are supported through ongoing

educational programs and trainings offered by the Metropolis Church Music Federation.

The Church Music Federation continues to be dedicated to providing resources to parishes to help them establish and sustain music programs for adults, youth and chanters. The Federation also offers Church Music Institutes throughout the Metropolis

Through innovative youth programs, our Metropolis provides a foundation in the faith by offering retreats, camps and special



events that create an environment of fellowship while building friendships that will last a lifetime. Annual Lenten retreats provide insight into the mystery of Christ's

Crucifixion and Resurrection, guiding participants in deepening their spiritual disciplines including fasting, prayer, and

the Sacrament of Confession. Retreats for Altar Boys focus on the importance of Acolyte service in our worship, and also provide a forum of vocational development for future service in the Church. Summer Camp has been a mainstay in the Metropolis with hundreds of youth

gathering each year at Saint Nicholas Ranch and Retreat Center for a fun-filled week of outdoor activities, art, sports, and worship, all offered within a safe and loving Orthodox Christian environment. In addition to the many diverse youth programs offered by the Metropolis, our parishes offer a wide array of activities including GOYA, Jr. GOYA, HOPE and JOY. Many communities offer special programs for families with small children, known affectionately as "Little Lambs", as a means of providing support for young mothers and their children. This program offers a safe, Christ-centered environment for their children to begin nurturing friendships with other Orthodox from the early formative years. Sports programs are also very popular, as are local retreats, regional Olympic Games, and community outreach

> activities to Project Mexico and Saint Innocent Orphanage.

Another strong program that promotes both our Christian and Hellenic Culture

is the Metropolis Folk Dance and Choral Festival which annually attracts thousands of dancers, singers, musicians, family and friends to witness the award-winning performances and the camaraderie of this dynamic ministry. This program intertwines Faith, Dance and Fellowship by offering daily worship as well as workshops which bring faith-based guidance to problems
