The Metropolis of San Francisco Philoptochos is exemplary in their service to others with such innovative programs as Kids 'n' Cancer, now offering five camps throughout the west for children with cancer and their families.

Founded in 1992, the Commission for Orthodox Missions and Evangelism (C.O.M.E.) was organized to educate and engage the faithful of the Metropolis in Evangelism and Mission to: fulfill the Great Commission of Christ (Matthew 28:19-20); assist in the establishment and growth of mission parishes to achieve self sufficiency; further the work and programs of the Orthodox Christian Mission Center (O.C.M.C.) in St. Augustine,

Educating and Engaging the faithful in Evangelism and Mission To fulfill the Great Commission of Christ

The Commission works to engage the Orthodox faithful of the Metropolis in understanding that we are all called

> to make disciples, to "proclaim the message of God's reality, and lead others to that reality through incorporation into the Church."

> The Commission assists in the planting of new parishes in urban/suburban areas which will serve

the needs of the Greek Orthodox faithful, potential converts, inactive Orthodox, and the unchurched. The location of a new mission parish is determined by the demographics and the needs as identified by the local leadership. In cities or towns with a small Orthodox population, the Commission works with the laity as they gather potential members, experience monthly or bimonthly liturgies, and plan for the future assignment of a full time priest.

COME has helped to establish the full time parishes of Holy Apostles Church in Shoreline, Washington; St. John the Baptist Church in Beaverton, Oregon; St. George Church in Eugene, Oregon; St. Andrew Church in San Luis Obispo, California; St. Nicholas Church in Temecula, California; St. Anna Church in Roseville, California; Greek Orthodox Mission of South Orange County in San Juan Capistrano, California; Greek Orthodox Mission of Flagstaff,

Arizona; and the Greek Orthodox Mission of Prescott, Arizona.



It also nurtures the growth of the Greek Orthodox mission churches in Pasco, Washington; Salem Oregon; Redding, California; Sierra Vista, Arizona; and Maui, Hawaii. In addition, COME has provided support to Mission efforts in Alaska, Africa, Ukraine, and South America.

The Commission receives funds for its work from Pennies and Prayers a joint mission awareness program with the Metropolis Philoptochos Society, from parish and individual donations, and from the Sts. Katherine and George Mission Endowment of the Metropolis of San Francisco.

The Board of the Commission is chaired by His Eminence Metropolitan Gerasimos and is composed of up to fifteen members, both clergy and laity, who are responsible for overall policy. It usually meets twice a year.

FAMILY WELLNESS CENTER

The Family Wellness Center ministry is a new program initially funded through a generous grant from the

Archbishop Iakovos Leadership 100 Endowment Fund, and is designed to create relevant programs for the spiritual, emotional and psychological wellness of the faithful of the Metropolis of San Francisco. Orthodox Christians struggle to lead a Christ-centered life while living in a largely secular society rife with clergy often suffer the same fates as those of their parishioners – marital

dissatisfaction, divorce, troubled children and substance abuse. Special attention is being paid to programs which address the needs of clergy and their families, offering for

them support, strength and guidance in Christ to enrich their personal lives and their ministries.

The Family Wellness Center will provide a safe environment to address challenges and provide a place to turn in times of personal or family crisis as well as to nurture spiritual growth. The Family Wellness Center is more than a program, more than a committee, more than a building. Rather,

it seeks to offer a

new and holistic way of looking at all the ministries and activities of the Church.



Saint Nicholas Ranch is a conference and retreat center nestled in the beautiful Sierra foothills minutes away from the Sequoia and Kings Canyon National Parks and only a short drive from Fresno, California. The Ranch hosts a variety of camps, retreats, and conferences for both Orthodox and non-Orthodox groups, offering comfortable and well-maintained facilities in a beautiful and tranquil mountain setting.

Located on 230 acres of what was once a working horse ranch, the lodges, meeting spaces and recreational facilities surrounded by



rolling hills, ancient oaks, a small lake, an apple orchard, and an olive grove combine to provide

a beautiful place for your stay. On a hillside overlooking the Ranch is the Convent of the Life-giving Spring of the Holy Theotokos, offering a spiritual oasis of Greek Orthodox worship and spirituality.

St. Nicholas Ranch can accommodate a wide range of groups and events with such versatile facilities as large conference halls and smaller rooms suited for meetings or "break-out" sessions.

The dining hall, where professional chefs prepare a variety of delicious meals and snacks, seats up to 150 and contains a large wood-burning fireplace.

Up to 90 people can be accommodated in our twenty-six beautiful lodge rooms, which feature private bathrooms and comfortable, resort style amenities. In addition, twelve dormitory rooms can house up to 144 people offering shared living quarters and bathrooms.

Saint Nicholas Ranch is open throughout the year, with activities to suit every season. During the spring, take a nature walk on one of the hiking trails and view the beautiful wildflowers. In the summer, enjoy a refreshing swim in the full-size pool. During the fall, go apple picking in the Ranch's private orchard. And in the winter, make an excursion to the snowy Sierras, just thirty minutes away.

At Saint Nicholas Ranch, we consider hospitality to be a sacred obligation. We will do whatever is in our power to make your event pleasant and memorable for all involved.

for all ages and interests. All of these programs are designed to bring youth and young adults closer to Christ, while instilling in them the importance of becoming the future leaders of our Church. The Office of Youth and Family Ministries for the Metropolis plans many special youth activities

throughout the year including: Lenten Retreats, Youth Rallies, Young Adult Ski weekends,

Altar Boy retreats, sports tournaments, and many other activities designed to bring youth closer to the Lord. The Metropolis of San Francisco also actively promotes the St. John Chrysostom Oratorical Festival at the parish, regional, Metropolis and Archdiocesan levels. Through the efforts of the Eastern Orthodox Commission on Scouting, several parishes have coordinated Boy Scout troops, teaching young men

important leadership skills, service to the community, and environmental education. One of the oldest and most

popular ministries is the Folk Dance and Choral Festival which has a rich history of popularity and excellence. Each year thousands of youth come together for a spiritual and exciting weekend to celebrate their

Orthodox faith and Hellenic culture in traditional Greek dance and song.

Summer Camp is a great way for youth in the Metropolis to learn about their faith, become immersed in daily worship, and meet

> others who share the same beliefs, values and culture.

Camps and retreats have continually proven to be a positive and lifetransforming experience that strengthens the faith of all those who

participate. Summer Camp is a week of fun, fellowship and faith-building. Campers participate in: campfires, theater, music, hiking, pool time,



Olympics, athletics, capture the flag, dodgeball, Orthodox Challenge sessions, stargazing and much more. Campers are also offered a rich liturgical experience with daily Orthros and Vespers, and weekly Divine Liturgy. For over 25 years, St. Nicholas Ranch near Fresno, California has served as home to the Metropolis Summer Camp. The Metropolis also now proudly offers five additional regional camps serving the areas of southern California, northern California, Oregon, Washington and Arizona.

Building and training leadership for youth ministries is vital to the success



of the programs which are offered. The Metropolis of San Francisco has implemented seminars and workshops for youth workers, religious educators and parents, designed to provide knowledge and skills to improve their service in this important ministry. Regional youth directors are currently being cultivated for volunteer service to assist in the planning and implementation of youth activities and programs throughout the Metropolis.

Regular annual activities include regional and metropolis-wide





CHURCH MUSIC

The Church Music Federation of the Metropolis of San Francisco continues to be a thriving ministry, which is dedicated to perpetuating the rich musical traditions of our Church. With nearly 1,000 active adult and youth choir members in the



Metropolis, the Federation maintains regular contact with members through a newsletter, regional Church Music Institutes and other educational opportunities offered throughout the Metropolis.

The Church Music Federation continues to be dedicated to providing the best resources to parishes to help them establish and sustain music programs for adults, youth



and chanters. Some of the areas of specialty in which guidance is offered include:

- Youth Music development of a youth music program, either as a separate youth choir or in conjunction with Sunday School
- Conducting Skills conducting, rehearsal techniques, repertoire selection
- Vocal Production training and developing better singers
- Organ Scholarships each year the Federation awards two scholarships to fund organ lessons for deserving candidates.
- Byzantine Chant resources and

- instruction for chanting in English and Greek for new chanters or for existing chanters to further their knowledge and skills
- Congregational Singing resources and materials to facilitate congregational worship


Each year the Federation offers Church Music Institutes throughout the Metropolis as a means of expanding the knowledge and repertoire of Church Musicians. These are provided free of charge throughout the Metropolis. The Federation has also been the author of a Conductor's Training Academy which provides valuable instruction to adult and youth choir directors to improve their skills and expand the music ministry of their respective parishes.

ORTHODOX SCOUTING PROGRAM

The Boy Scouts of America offers three basic levels of programs for youth – Cub Scouts for boys aged approximately 6 to 10, Boy Scouts for boys aged 11 to 17, and Ventures and Sea Scouts for boys and girls aged 14-20.

Programs currently offered at some parishes within the Metropolis of San Francisco include Orthodox Boy Scouts and Venturing. Pan-Orthodox Scouting events are also encouraged to create an even greater sense of fellowship in the faith.

Virtually all faiths

make religious awards available for their youth who are registered in Scouting. Orthodox Boy Scouts are eligible to earn the Alpha-Omega award, approved for all jurisdictions by the Standing Conference of Canonical Orthodox Bishops. This award requires Orthodox youth to learn more about their Faith, have an active prayer life, and do service projects for the Church.

MONASTIC COMMUNITIES


